## APGS SECURITY

We raised the 67k needed to pay for the community patrolling service from September 2024 through February 2025. We will start fundraising for the next round late January. Even though we have had break-ins (especially in crime peak months: April & October), crime rate is still much more under control in regards to the incremental growth of our town and only 2 night time patrollers.

The committee has supported all of us with security newsletters and an informative security Town Hall that we hosted early November.

# APGS SECURITY

## PLEASE KEEP IN MIND THAT:

- In CR it is most likely that criminals will not be put in jail for stealing. For this please practice prevention applying suggested safety tips below shared.
- The way we prevent crime through fundraising as a community is by having the presence of patrollers to make it uncomfortable for criminals to lurk around and have a more immediate assistance in case of an incident.
- 911 can attend calls in Spanish & English.
- Please file claims as they can bring more law enforcement support for security in a Playa Grande.
- Police Force in Brasilito can come pick you up and take you to their office to file a claim. Phone number: 2600-2086.
- APGS Security Committee is working on getting set up with OIJ to file claims online in PG.
- The committee is also working on a new community safety strategy that involves cameras monitored live and real time patroller response (ACTIVE vrs REACTIVE). Regarding theft- Getting caught in action is the only way to put a criminal behind bars. We will share more information in the near future.
- APGS is pressuring Coope Guanacaste to install more public lighting and to fix burnt bulbs.

## WE NEED YOUR COLLABORATION WITH:

**PROPERTY CLEANING:** We kindly ask empty lot owners to keep your lot clean. Keep the surroundings of the houses as clean as possible of both weeds, as well as grass; this to allow a better view for the patrolman and avoid the enabling of hiding spots for potential criminals.

**PROPERTY LIGHTING:** As far as possible, install lights with a motion sensor around the properties for a better view of the external part of the properties. (Please use downward- facing lights to avoid light pollution).

**SPECIFIC INFORMATION:** Inform the entire population in general that at the time of making a report of an incident (theft, assault, riots, loss of belongings) be clear in the place where the event occurred, as well as be clear in the characteristics of the person or people involved this is extremely important example: (color of clothing, shoes, physical features, tattoos, type and color of vehicle).

**MONITOR:** If it is possible that the different cameras are monitored in real time, this would be of great help to patrolmen.

**ALARM SYSTEM:** Urge different homeowners to install an alarm system.

**PREVENTION:** Make sure that both doors and windows as well as gates are properly closed when leaving your homes.

**GET TO KNOW YOUR NEIGHBOR:** Invite them into the community chats and to contribute with the cost of the community patrolling service.

**COMMUNICATE:** instruct all people in charge of taking care of the different houses, businesses, premises to report any suspicious person or vehicle as soon as possible via SoSafe, neighborhood chats or to the GRCOE patrollers emergency number: +506 8821-5775

## APGS ROAD SAFETY

This committee (Oscar Venegas, Fernando Ortuño, Anne Roberts, Sebastian Artiñano, Steven Molina and Leandro Fernandez) has spent a lot of time in meetings with politicians and public officials to establish allies who support this initiative. For the first stage we aim to build a sidewalk from the main beach access towards the PG school. If we are able to, we will continue to the ASADA and for following stages, all the way to The Store.

- The Municipality provided the right of way last week so that, with the support of the study from the engineering students of UCR, MOPT will proceed to draw out the design of the sidewalk (pre-project and budget) with the secretary of sectoral planning.

- With the preliminary project in hand we will proceed to raise, among us neighbors, the funds needed for the construction. The government will provide the machinery.

- Parallel to the above, Don Oscar Venegas is drafting the agreement (APGS-Muni-Mopt) to legalize the process.

The agreement would be a collaboration as such:

- \*The PG community (APGS) collects the funds.

- \*Municipality provides the permits.

- \*MOPT executes preliminary project, design and construction.

- \*CONAVI provides ongoing maintenance.

# PG GREEN CURTAIN PROTECTION COLLABORATION

## (ADE Ambiente PG, APGS, SINAC & Sostenibilidad en Grande)

The green curtain is one of the phenotypes responsible for the scenic beauty of Playa Grande, characterizing its wide desolate and green coastline. It is of great ecological importance due to:

- It protects the dune as a nesting site for sea turtles.
- It is a biological corridor of coastal species such as birds, iguanas, crabs, among others.
- It reduces sonic and light pollution directed towards the beach.
- It mitigates erosion and the effects of climate change (high tides, strong winds).

This system of coastal vegetation is part of the Las Baulas Marine National Park, but it requires the control of everyone to protect it from potential deforestation due to forest fires and future development in seek of personalized beach access trails.

APGS is working with SINAC, ADE Ambiente de Playa Grande, Sostenibilidad en Grande and you to raise the necessary awareness to maintain a 2.5km firebreak delimiting the perimeter between private property and the National Park / protected area. The objective is to have this fire break be used as a pedestrian and bike shaded trail for its maintenance and provide signage to inform locals & visitors about the protected area and where the nearest beach access is located.

In support of the coastal reforestation and restoration plan of the ADE Ambiente de Playa Grande, SINAC, Mi Bosque and Costas Verdes we protect the "green curtain" with a firebreak that runs parallel to the beach along the 50-75 meter line between The Taco Star to Casa Verde, Palm Beach Estates (2.5km).

We concluded the first stage of the Green Curtain Project firebreak!

The SINAC topographer set all the points and we cleared about half. Next volunteering outreach will be to clear the second half of the fire break and start the signage installation.

We'll keep ya'll posted!

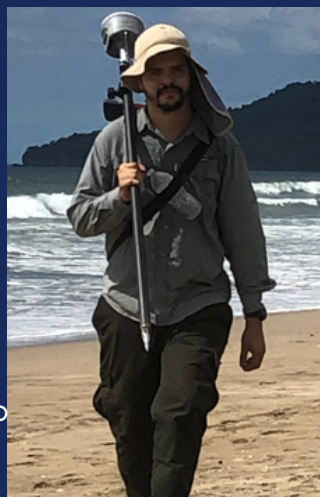
